

COMMIT CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Founder's Hall, The Barnes Learning Center and Campus Maintenance Facility:

St Luke's general contractor for the Founder's Hall project, Aagaard Juergensen, picked up our building permit from Orange County on June 27 and immediately started mobilizing to commence construction. The playground was disassembled, site demolition and clearing completed, the building pad has been prepared and dewatering and digging footings is well underway. During August we'll see completion of concrete footings and foundation walls, underground site utilities, under-slab rough in of electrical, plumbing, IT and AV/lighting conduits, concrete block elevator pit and stairwells and everything needed to prepare to pour the floor slab in early September.

You may have noticed the chain link construction fence around the construction area includes a large area of Bldg A's parking lot. The walls of Founder's Hall are tilt-wall concrete panels and this is the area where these wall panels will be formed and poured prior to being erected on the building pad.

There are several other responsibilities that are managed in my ministry area. I'm in charge of maintaining the marriage, Baptism, and funeral records for our church family. In addition, I see that weekly worship attendance is entered into the church database. (We have some wonderful volunteers that assist me with this!) So don't forget to share/pass the basket with the Connection Cards in worship. And please print your name clearly! I hope you'll feel free to note any changes in your contact information on the back of the Connection Card.

If you've been a member for more than a year or two, I'd be happy to hear from you and confirm that our records for you (and your family) are correct. And if I've been in contact with you, I want to take this opportunity to thank you for taking the time to return my calls and emails.

In short, our church staff and church family are made up of some of the most gifted, talented and committed people. And I count it a blessing to be a member of the Commit Team and this wonderful church family!

Coalition for the Homeless: St. Luke's has partnered with Coalition for the Homeless since the early 1990s, providing hot meals each third Saturday of the month to people experiencing homelessness in Central Florida. Use your gifts of hospitality, serving, and cooking to feed those experiencing homelessness. Bakers are needed from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the St. Luke's main kitchen in Building C. Elementary age children are welcome.

Family Promise: St. Luke's serves as a host for the Family Promise families 4-5 times a year. We convert some of our Sunday school rooms into bedrooms and part of the Fellowship Hall into a dining and family room for the families. The success of this ministry is entirely dependent on volunteers. It takes 50-60 volunteers each week our Family Promise guests are here. We need volunteers to help make dinners, sleep over as overnight hosts, donate snacks and drinks, wash linens at the end of the week, as well as setting up the beds and taking them down. All ages from toddlers to grandparents can help out. Family Promise will be on campus September 25 through October 1.

Sunday Coffee and Snack Team: Help make coffee and replenish donuts one Sunday each month during one of three time slots.


Tuesday Morning Volunteers: Come help on Tuesday mornings with various church projects for all ages and experience levels.



CONGREGATION SNAPSHOT



Age






Gender
