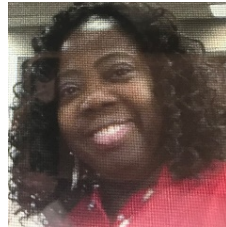

At times I get so busy “doing God’s work” that I forget to allow God to “work in me.” At the beginning of the year, I selected the verse above as part of the signature for my UMW email account to remind me to take time to be still and listen to God’s voice when I am too entrenched in the “work.” Each time I reply to an email from that account, I practice being still. The spiritual discipline of being still to listen to God’s voice helped calm my anxiety and guided my decisions for the Conference organization.

As our world seemed quickly to come to a halt with the words “stay home,” “social distancing,” “quarantine,” flashing on our screens, another disturbing email arrived: Mission u cannot happen as designed. As I touched the small reply arrow with a trembling finger, I read “Be still, and know that I am God.” That split second brought my mind to our 2020 Conference events theme: “Moving Forward in Unity.” At first, I thought “how can we move forward amid so many uncertainties? How can we move forward not knowing if we will be able to gather at all this summer? Then, I read “I am exalted among the nations; I am exalted in the earth.” This reminded me we are not in charge of the “if” or the “when;” we should not be anxious about them either.

Therefore, we are moving forward with plans to bring the Anxiety study to children and youth across the conference and to our membership. We are moving forward with our planning for the Spiritual Enrichment Retreat in September with the Rev. Monique McBride. We are moving forward with plans for the Annual Meeting in November with our General Secretary/CEO, Harriett Jane Olson. We are leaving the unknown to the One who holds the future.

When Cornerstone Family Ministries (our National Mission Institution in Tampa) put out the call for 7000 masks for children and 1000 masks for teachers, I knew that members of United Methodist Women would respond and the sewing machines would be humming! Initially I decided to leave this effort to those accomplished seamstresses among us, but deciding that even a drop in the bucket is still at least a drop, I pulled my sewing machine from the back corner of the closet and dusted it off. Not having a clue how to begin, I reached out to Sharon Dixon (First Land O’Lakes UMW), who had already sewn dozens of masks. After receiving some initial advice, I called Sue Parker (New Hope UMW), who I often rely on for many things, and learned about t-shirt yarn, among other valuable tips. Margaret Masters (Lake Magdalene UMW) provided supplies, including oodles of t-shirts for the aforementioned t-shirt yarn. Judi Levan (First Land O’Lakes UMW) isn’t sewing, but ordered 100 yards of hard-to-come-by elastic for those of us who are. So many women working together, each contributing in her own way. What a blessing!

Like many other things in these crazy times, Mission Giving is presenting unique challenges. Many of the faithful women in FCUMW are facing financial setbacks. This, along with the cancellation of circle meetings and district events, is bound to have an effect. We need creative solutions to keep United Methodist Women afloat at all levels, engaging in mission for women, children and youth. This is more important now than ever.

Those of our women who are facing financial hardship need to be encouraged to take care of their own needs first, and honor their Mission Giving pledges when able. Those of you who can, please remember to honor your pledge, and perhaps exceed it, to help make up for our sisters who are struggling.

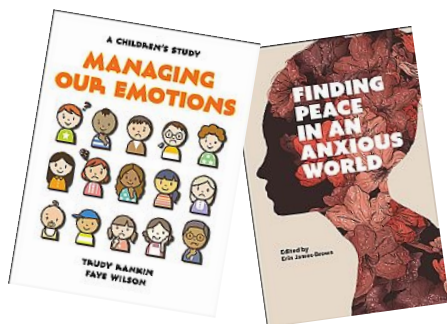

The topic is anxiety from a spiritual perspective.

We believe that in our current fear-induced environment it is our responsibility to offer the youth and children's studies (Managing Anxiety, Managing Our Emotions) to the young people and their parents in our districts and local congregations in 2020. We owe this to our children and youth as they will be dealing with the trauma of the COVID-19 outbreak for a long time. We are still in the discussion stage but hope to have plans for implementation as soon as we can gather in large groups.

The spiritual growth study for adults is titled "Finding Peace in an Anxious World." We can think of nothing more relevant for us today as we face the reality of the first major coronavirus pandemic since 1918. We would like to have a Zoom-based version of this study available this summer. We will keep you informed.

The Conference Mission u Committee is meeting in May to coordinate the details and make plans for implementing all three 2020 spiritual growth mission studies and other Mission u events in our districts and local churches. Meanwhile we encourage each unit to order at least one copy of the study books for now. ## South East District Units' Responses to COVID-19 Social Isolation

I'm overwhelmed by the action and enthusiasm from our South East District units as they cope with the social isolation brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. Of course, there are a lot of meeting cancellations, but I'm so impressed with the innovative solutions our units employ for connecting with each other: Here are a few examples:

- Pat Gibson, Key West unit president, reports that she has “learned a lot about technology in past couple of weeks, reaching out to members via email, telephone,” and moving to Zoom meetings soon.
- Miramar unit president Ola Duhaney reports that they “are communicating daily on our WhatsApp Women's page, e-mails, and by calling each other and praying with them.”
- First Boca unit president Pam Davis emailed me a list of activities her unit is doing to connect people, including the following:
  - We began a new effort, “CARE”, Connecting and Reaching Everyone (in the unit and prospective members). Their Executive Committee makes contacts at least 2-3 times a week by phone, text, emails.
  - Sending almost daily updates regarding UMW opportunities from the website, Faith Talks podcasts, along with a focus on the Reading Program, and justice/advocacy info.
  - Focusing on church members in nursing homes, helping families see each other through Duo and FaceTime on their cell phones.
  - Helping through ongoing efforts to get people the ABC's of effectively using technology.
  - Utilizing a program from the Program Book via Zoom in a circle meeting, and incorporating some tips like mindfulness, stress, and other strategies that she has learned about from reading the Anxiety Mission Study.
- Other units are also looking into Zoom as a way to meet and are asking for help.



- And finally, Burton Memorial secretary Edith Zewadski-Bricker reports that as of April 29, UMWomen Jeanine Stelzner and Pat Fincannon made 137 protective masks for teachers and children at Cornerstone Family Ministries in Tampa.
