## Volunteer Leader Positions & Descriptions

### Youth Counselors | Sunday Morning Small Group Leaders

Being a Youth Counselor seems like a huge responsibility, but one that comes with great rewards, both now and in the future. Youth Counselors serve as mentors and small group leaders for St. Luke's Youth on Sunday and Wednesday Nights for either middle school or high school students. Relationship building is big when it comes to Youth Ministry. As a Youth Counselor, you'll see that first-hand as students look to you for not only spiritual, but also moral guidance as well. You will also guide small groups in discussions about the lesson. (All lessons will be provided a week ahead of time.) This is a commitment of 2 -3 hours on Sunday and/or Wednesday Nights (plus time on trips/events). Youth Counselors are the glue that keeps things together, interacting with students and engaging in their lives in a powerful way. You are a testimony to the love of Christ as you live your life and serve this ministry. Students will look to you for support, encouragement and wisdom and they will see your life as a living testimony to the love of Jesus. Spending time investing in these teens is life giving, and it speaks in a powerful way to our students. (*Youth Counselors will get yearly Youth Ministry Leadership Training*) This is a one year commitment starting and ending each July.

- **Youth Counselors** | Wednesday (Middle School) and Sunday (High School) Youth Group
- **Sunday Morning Small Group Leaders** | MERGE (5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Grade), SUBMERGE (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade), & DEEPER (High School)

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Prioritizing being at Youth Group each week.
- Read and prepare for teaching of the curriculum
- Build meaningful relationships with students
- Help set up for worship
- Crowd control and monitoring
- Monitoring check-in on Sunday and/or Wednesday nights, trips/events, etc.
- Being available to talk with and pray with students
- Needed: 10 volunteers with at least 6 on a weekly basis; team will grow as youth group continues to grow
- Attend Youth Leaders Meetings (every other month)
- Attend and help lead on trips and events
- Set the vibe - students look to you for excitement, buy in and interest in the message, the worship and in St. Luke's Youth trips/events.
- Background Check & Yearly Youth Ministry Leadership Training

## **Youth Ministry Greeter**

The main task of The Greeter is just that. You'll be the Youth Connection Point person. You are the person that and the first smile that youth will see. You'll greet youth (and/or parents and other youth ministry volunteers) with a main objective to make all feel welcome as soon as they arrive.

### **Responsibilities:**

- Needed: 6 volunteers; team will grow as youth group continues to grow
- Prioritizing being at the beginning of Youth Group (Sunday mornings 9AM – 9:30AM, and on Sunday and Wednesday nights 6:15PM – 6:45PM in rotation with other Greeters).
- Monitoring check-in for Youth Group, trips/events, etc.
- Build meaningful relationships with students

## **Youth Dinner Provider**

The main task of a Youth Dinner Provider is just that. You'll cook and serve dinner to our high school youth on Sunday evenings (on rotation with other youth parents and volunteers). Please contact Antony Larry to volunteer.

### **Responsibilities:**

- Prepare meals for 20 – 30 high school youth and volunteers (Donations are appreciated, but you will be reimbursed upon request)
  - Set up and serve on Sundays starting at 6:30PM, and cleaning up by 7:00PM
  - Be in contact with Antony Larry about scheduling and menu
- If you cannot serve for any given night that you are scheduled, you agree to let the Student Ministry Directors know at least one week in advance*

## **Youth Trips/Events Drivers**

The main task of a Trips/Events Driver is just that. You'll help transport youth on special events and trips to provide a safe and fun way to get to and from each event or trip. This commitment is on an as needed basis.

### **Responsibilities:**

- Attend and help lead on trips and events
  - Must have a valid Drivers License
  - Keep a clean and safe driving record
- If you cannot drive for any given trip/event, you agree to let the Student Ministry Directors know at least one week in advance*
