BUILDING FAITH AND COMMUNITY TOGETHER

When Hurricane Ike destroyed the Methodist church in the small town of Melones, Cuba, in 2008, all that remained was a concrete slab under a thatched roof. Still, worship continued.

Sixteen years later, that slab has become the foundation of something much greater. Thanks to generous gifts from St. Luke's partners through the Missions Endowment Fund, a new sanctuary now stands in its place — safe, joyful and full of hope.

The journey began in 2010 through the Florida Conference's Methodists United in Prayer initiative, which connected St. Luke's with Melones Methodist Church. The first project was a parsonage to provide safe housing for the pastor, laying the groundwork for a lasting partnership.

In 2024, the dream of a new church became a reality. The sanctuary seats 75 — double the original capacity — and serves not only as a place of worship but also as a certified hurricane shelter.

During a recent visit, the St. Luke's mission team joined worship and shared a meal with the congregation. The Rev.

Ramón Otamendi Castillo expressed his gratitude. "Many have come to know God's love through this church," he said. "We are growing together through prayer and study."

A local leader echoed that sentiment. "We thank God for the new church, which also serves the community in times of need," Norlinda Leyva Osorio said. "We're grateful for St. Luke's love and unconditional support. We are praying for you."

Support from St. Lukers also helped purchase land for a community garden and build a small space for Sunday classes, expanding ministry to children and families.

This is more than construction — it's transformation. Through shared mission, faith and generosity, Melones and St. Luke's are building something lasting.

And there's still more to come. Continued support for the Missions Endowment Fund will help this vibrant ministry grow and reach even more people with God's love.

## MUSIC CREATES BELONGING

When Timothy Lewis stepped onto the stage as one of the performers for the HymnSong concert at St. Luke's, he didn't realize the journey he was beginning.

Like so many others, he came for the music but left with something deeper: purpose, joy and a renewed calling. Today, he sings in the sanctuary choir, pouring his heart into songs that move and inspire others.

"(HymnSong) sparked a desire for me to continue to share my gift and find an outlet that allows me to spread the good news and love of Christ," Lewis said. "I truly feel I am in the right place at the right time."

A partnership between St. Luke's and Encore! Performing Arts, HymnSong has become a treasured tradition made possible through generous gifts to the Traditional Choir and Orchestra Endowment Fund. Since its inception, the musical event has offered 2,000

guests the opportunity to experience new and familiar interpretations of beloved hymns.

But it's not just a concert. It's a spiritual experience that welcomes newcomers and offers them a place to belong. Of the 152 musicians who have participated to date, 108 were guests. Many now call St. Luke's their spiritual home.

Sandy Kupetz is one of them. "Now I get to do this every week with my new choir friends," she said. "An added bonus is getting to experience this with my daughter, who also joined the choir after an amazing HymnSong experience."

Music is more than melody at St. Luke's — it's ministry. Continued giving to the Traditional Choir and Orchestra Endowment Fund preserves this musical legacy and helps deepen people's faith through the power of song.

## EMPOWERED TO SERVE

When John Shughart felt called to attend Duke Divinity School in Durham, North Carolina, he knew the journey would come with financial challenges. While exploring options within the Florida Conference, he discovered the McKeefery Seminary Scholarship Fund at St. Luke's and applied with hope.

"The scholarship allowed me to go into seminary worrying less about finances and focusing more on what God had called me to do," he said.

Thanks to the McKeefery Scholarship — and others across the conference — Shughart graduated from Duke in May 2023 without taking on student loans. That freedom gave him the ability to fully engage in seminary life and ministry preparation.

"It freed me up to participate fully at Duke," he said. "And it meant I could serve without the burden of debt hanging over my head."

During and after seminary, Shughart served at Glendale Heights UMC in Durham, Lena Vista UMC in Auburndale and Community of Faith UMC in Davenport. Now, he and his wife, Emily, also a Florida Conference elder, are serving together at Asbury UMC in Maitland.

"To the donors, I say, 'thank you,' " he added. "Your generosity makes it possible for students like me to follow our call without fear. You are equipping leaders for the future of the church."

Shughart encourages others to consider giving to the scholarship fund.

"This is one of the hardest times in history to commit to seminary," he said. "But also one of the most important. We need strong, courageous clergy — and scholarships like McKeefery's make that possible."

OUR FUNDS

MINISTRY FOR GENERATIONS

The nine permanent endowment funds established at St. Luke's ensure the congregation's values and legacies live on for generations to come. They provide resources for initiatives that don't receive budgeted funds, enabling the church to offer new and innovative ministries well into the future.

ARTS FUND

Dedicated to funding visual and performing arts across all worship styles and ministries to support both spiritual enrichment and creative expression.

CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FUND

Provides resources for major building repairs, renovations and campus improvement, ensuring the church's physical spaces remain welcoming and functional.

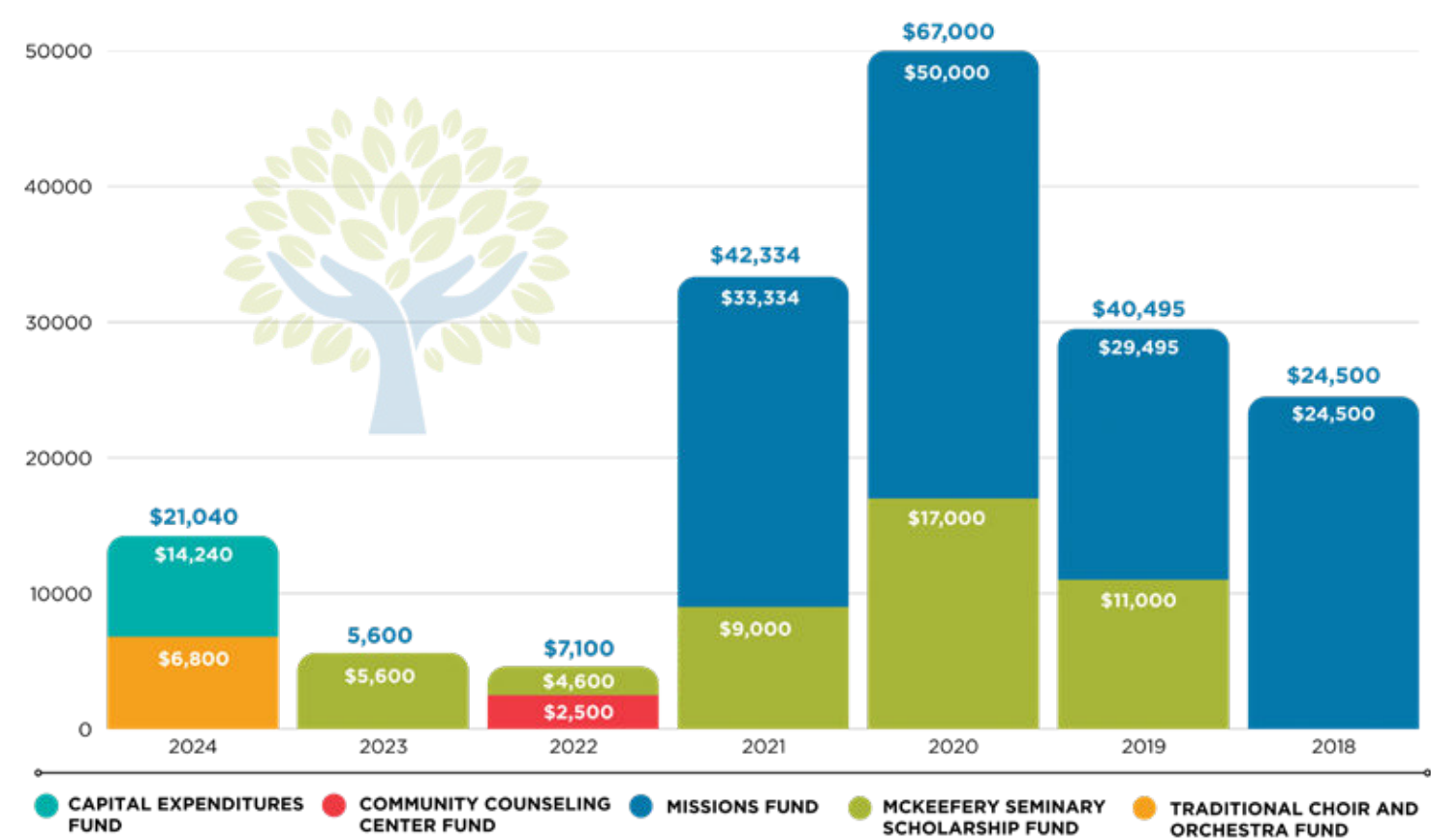

All endowment gifts are carefully invested through the [Florida United Methodist Foundation](http://www.fumf.org) (www.fumf.org), a partner that specializes in managing church-related funds with financial prudence.

The foundation invests in a diversified portfolio that includes fixed income, equities and socially screened investments aligned with United Methodist principles. Its investment committee provides ongoing oversight to ensure long-term stability and sustainable growth.

- St. Luke's endowments benefit from:
- **Pooled investment funds** to reduce risk and increase efficiency.
  - **Quarterly performance reporting and benchmarking.**
  - **Professional fund management** guided by ethical standards and fiduciary responsibility.
